English - Dagger
knife, stiletto, dirk, poniard, short sword

Hebrew - דָּגָר - Dagar

The weapon associated with dagar is usually the sword, though a spear is the instrument in Num 25:8.

Dagger: Late 14th century, apparently from Old French dague "dagger," from Old Provençe, dague, of uncertain origin.
